Research Focus: I conduct research and publish extensively on the institutional arrangements for the governance and management of natural resources. I have conducted research and advised governments in over 20 countries. I have advised the Asian Development Bank on the development of a biodiversity conservation program in China (including Yunnan Province) for joint implementation with the Global Environment Facility.

Graduate Training Focus: I have advised over 35 Ph.D. students—all of whom developed research programs in the area of natural resource economics, or on the role of natural resources in economic development. My doctoral students have conducted field research in 11 developing countries. I recently presented two lectures on institutional economics to graduate students at the China Center for Economic Research at the University of Peking.
